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The portrait on page 268 was painted by J. W. and E. L. Dodge in Nashville, Tennessee, on November 20, 18—. The other three William Walker portraits are undated and the painter or photographer unidentified. The photograph on page 14 was reproduced from a newspaper clipping; it had appeared in William O. Scroggs' *Filibusters and Financiers*, originally published in 1916.
