The Lower California flag was drawn from its description on page 217; for the California Republic flag, the one depicted in the encyclopedia was used as a model. For "Adjutant Ruland writing dispatches," a contemporaneous drawing of "Walker's men writing dispatches home" served as example (published by Rosengarten in *Freebooters Must Die!*, p. 43). Walker's portrait is a copy of copies of an engraving by J. C. Buttre, of New York, originally published in *The War in Nicaragua* in 1860. Randolph's portrait was painted by Walter Noel in Wytheville, Virginia in 1848; Crocker Art Gallery owns the original. Nugent's portrait was reproduced from the *Overland Monthly*, Sept. 1894. Crabb's photograph was taken by Taber in San Francisco prior to Crabb's departure for Sonora in 1857; the original of which is in the possession of his grand-niece, Mrs. Mary Barrow Collins of Los Angeles, California. The view of D Street, Marysville is from *Hutching's Magazine*, Feb. 1859.
